
Dear City of Roseville Parks and Rec,



Isabel M Bravo Park

Isabel M Bravo was a Roseville community leader and activist who had a big impact in Roseville. She was an early helper and feeder of the poor and homeless as well as an advocate for the mentally ill.

She helped turn Old Town Roseville into a viable commercial business area from a semi-skid row. Today, the businesses there are thriving. She opened her restaurant there and immediately started to help improve the area.

She was very active in community programs: 10 years with Placer County Concilio, Roseville Neighborhood Council, summer camps and summer food programs for children, Headstart Program, Roseville Police Women's Club, 12 year chairperson for Title One. She started Breakfast for Children at the Presbyterian Church. She was co-founder of the Los Carneles Youth Club de Roseville. She served on the Placer County Grand Jury. She received special thanks from Governor Brown for helping the homeless. She was twice elected chairperson for NAMI (helping the mentally ill), chairperson for H.O.R.A. and with the Parliamentary Association.

She owned the Old Town Restaurant for many years and was active in improving the area, as well as giving the homeless a meal & words of encouragement. She was a founder of the Old Town Merchants Association and was the founder of the Strawberry Festival. It had its beginning in Old Town and in a few years got too big and moved to the Fairgrounds,

Even in her struggle with Parkinson's, she made the time to attend Parkinson's Support Groups to help and encourage others.

My favorite story of Isabel helping the poor and hungry was forming an alliance with the owners of KFC, then located at Douglas & Keehner. Whenever they had extra chicken at closing time, they would call Isabel. She would take her daughter to help her, drive to KFC and pick up the chicken, and distribute it to the needy of Roseville. She knew who needed help through her involvement in community groups.

Isabel M Bravo passed away on 12-13-2013 and left a legacy in our community, as a volunteer, businessperson and role model.

In addition to all that she did to better Roseville, she was also a loving wife, mother and grandmother, raising a large family.

She is missed and treasured by her Community and family to this day!

Park Naming Process Parks, Recreation & Libraries

- Vern J. Newton -
7/22

On June 16 2021, the City Council approved revisions to the Park Naming Process. This process applies to parks and Parks, Recreation & Libraries (PRL) facilities only. "PRL facilities" are defined as recreation facilities, rooms within PRL buildings, and amenities within parks including, but not limited to, sports fields, groves of trees, walkways and trails. There is a separate naming process for City buildings and other City facilities.

Process

In July of each year, notification is made to the public and interested individuals that name suggestions are being sought for new parks and facilities that will be under construction during that fiscal year period (July 1 to June 30). This suggestion period is open for the month of July. Names should be submitted to the City Clerk and forwarded to the Park Planning and Development Superintendent.

At the conclusion of the suggestion period, the names received will be considered as follows:

1. The Park Naming Subcommittee shall review the list and make recommendations for park and/or facility names, using the criteria outlined below, to the Parks & Recreation Commission. The Park Naming Subcommittee shall consist of the following staff:
 - a. Parks, Recreation & Libraries Director
 - b. Park Planning and Development Superintendent
 - c. Park Development Project Manager (one representative serving a two-year term, to be rotated among Park Development Project Managers)
 - d. PRL Superintendent from the Parks Division (one representative serving a two-year term, to be rotated among PRL Superintendents from the Parks Division)
 - e. PRL staff member chosen "at-large", who shall serve a two-year term
 - f. Staff member from the Development Services Department (one representative serving a two-year term, to be rotated among Development Services staff)Two-year terms shall be staggered to provide continuity in the rotational representation.
2. Names received shall be considered "active" for both the current and following fiscal years, and will be considered for those parks and facilities scheduled for construction during those same fiscal years.
3. A name suggestion cannot be submitted more than three consecutive years.
4. The Park Naming Subcommittee maintains the right to select a name not included on the "active" list, due to special circumstances such as historical significance, the passing of an active contributor(s) to the community, or other considerations.

Criteria for Naming a Park Facility

The act of naming is significant and meaningful. A name can invoke powerful emotions, create images and help to recall history. The naming of a park or facility is intended to be a permanent act, and therefore should be approached in a thoughtful manner. The name of a park or facility may take into consideration the past, present and future history of the land, its use, and our relationship to it. The following criteria and factors shall be considered when naming or renaming a park or facility:

- Recognition of nearby prominent geographical locations (e.g., street names, subdivision names, or adjacent school names)
- Recognition of significant natural and geological features of the area
- Recognition of outstanding features of the park or facility
- Recognition of historical or cultural significance in the area
- Recognition of significant individuals within the community, as follows:
 - The person contributed a significant amount of land or funding for the park or facility (typically amounting to 50% or more of development costs).
 - The person has made significant volunteer contributions to the Roseville community and its residents' quality of life.
 - The person is deceased and is being recognized for substantial volunteer contributions to the quality of life in Roseville.
 - The person died in the line of duty as part of City service.

Naming of new parks or facilities should also consider:

- Including "Roseville" for regional or city-wide parks and facilities
- Avoiding duplication of names in order to ease confusion of sites and locations for the general public

The Subcommittee reserves the right to consider exceptions due to extraordinary circumstances, which inspire vision and civic engagement. Exceptions can be made when the actions or contributions of an individual not normally meeting the established criteria are so significant and profound that this person deserves consideration.

It is noted that the City of Roseville is grateful for the sacrifices of our fallen soldiers and veterans who served our country. With limited parks and facilities available, it is difficult to place a higher value or honor of one life over another. Therefore, honoring our fallen soldiers and veterans shall be directed to existing veteran-related programs within the City.

Re-naming of an existing park or facility, due to costs, potential loss of neighborhood identity and other considerations, shall be discouraged. The City Council reserves the right to add to the name of an existing park not named after a person or family, due to special circumstances. In such cases, the original park name shall not be replaced. Under these special circumstances, community contributions towards the offset of costs incurred to change signage shall be considered in the approval process.

Name Selection Process

1. The Subcommittee shall review all names and recommend up to three names for each new park or facility to the Parks & Recreation Commission.
2. The recommended names, along with the full list of submissions (including the "active" names from the previous year), shall be reviewed by the Parks and Recreation Commission for consideration at a formal meeting. The Parks and Recreation Commission shall recommend up to three names for each new park or facility to the City Council.
3. The recommended names, along with the full list of submissions (including the "active" names from the previous year), shall be reviewed by the City Council for approval at a formal meeting.
4. Family members of any potential namesakes shall be contacted by PRL staff prior to final approval by City Council, to ensure their support of the recommendation.
5. The Annual Park Naming Process shall conclude upon City Council's final approval of the park or facility name.

- At age 21, Joseph (Joe) Colnar moved to Roseville with his parents who immigrated from Croatia around 1900. The Colnar family first settled near Walsenburg, Colorado, then moved to Red Lodge, Montana in 1920. His father, Frank Colnar, was a coal miner. There were 13 children total, most of whom were born in the USA. In 1925, the parents, four sons, and three daughters moved to Roseville where they built a house on 22 acres on the south end of Keehner Avenue. The house is still there. The sons all worked for the Southern Pacific Railroad. The two youngest daughters graduated from Roseville High School in the 1930s.
- At age 31, Joe married Alice Bradley from Fair Oaks in 1935, and they eventually had two daughters, Carole and Sharry.
- Joe served on the Roseville City Council from 1946 until 1962 (4 terms). His 5 proudest achievements during his 16 council years were the underpass to Washington Blvd, the continuation of Folsom Rd. across Dry Creek to Vernon St., the establishment of Roseville's independent electric service, the building of Roseville's first community hospital and Diamond Oaks Golf Course.
- Joe was an avid golfer and charter member of Sierra View Country Club (1956) until the late-1980s. He was the ultimate fan of the SF Giants, 49ers, and Warriors. He died in December 1996, three weeks shy of his 93rd birthday.
- Joe leaves behind 2 daughters (both of Roseville), 4 grandchildren (2 in Roseville), 8 great-grandchildren, and 4 great-great-grandchildren. Please consider naming a Roseville Park facility after Baron Reed. The reasons for this suggestion are his accomplishments in promoting the public interest & quality of life of Roseville Residents.

Baron Reed continues to be the youngest Roseville Mayor ever elected at age 28 in 1970 for a whopping \$15/month. While on the Council he supported requiring construction fees aimed at building neighborhood parks, which has contributed to the quality of many Roseville neighborhoods. He promoted a Floodplain Ordinance to protect vulnerable homes & businesses. A letter he wrote to the Press Tribune favoring the Ordinance was published as a 4-part series. The Ordinance led to the acquisition of right of way for flood control, preservation of wildlife & fish habitat, bicycle & walking trails. Baron enthusiastically supported the original 90-acre land acquisition at the Native American burial grounds for a future Regional (Maidu) Park.

During his time in service, the Council set “user fees” for park & recreation programs to relieve the tax burden on the general taxpayer, reformed the then City owned Roseville Hospital fiscal practices to benefit the public interest, approved affordable housing standards & passed a noise ordinance protecting residential neighborhoods.

Baron Reed promoted the City partnering with schools, first at Crestmont Park/School, then with the RJUHSD, suggesting an Olympic-size swimming pool at Oakmont H.S., which eventually came to fruition at Woodcreek H.S., as part of the Roseville Aquatics Complex.

Baron ran on a platform to attract industries to diversify Roseville’s economy. The State Route #65 plan was re-located from west to east Roseville opening a corridor for commercial, industrial & residential development. City Manager Hutchison worked hard to eventually attract Olean Tile Company to the Industrial District. The Council planned & authorized building a Waste Water Treatment Plant returning river quality water back to the environment & a new Public Safety Building, thereby modernizing the city.

He served as the City’s representative on Placer County LAFCO promoting efficient government & wise land use, & what is now SACOG planning & approving regional transportation networks with an eye on moving people & traffic while lessening its impact on air quality. Consistent with these goals, the City Council established Roseville Transit.

Baron Reed also influenced other Roseville citizens to get involved in their local City government. Mayor Pauline Roccucci said former Roseville Mayor Baron Reed is partially to thank for her involvement in local government. As a family friend, Baron nominated Pauline’s well qualified husband Richard, to the Planning Commission. Observing his involvement sparked Pauline’s interest. “Baron Reed showed us how we could really be a part of the community,” she said.

The Pelzman Family has a long history of Roseville residents and generations of public and community service. Our hope is to honor that with a park name.

The first generation of the Pelzman Family immigrated to Roseville in 1911 from Austria. Katie and John Pelzman arrived in July 1911 to Roseville, CA residing on Riverside and then Clinton Avenue. Their first son, the first generation American, Rudy Pelzman, Sr worked for Southern Pacific Railroad and Western Pacific Railroad. Rudy Sr was also a World War II veteran and later a member of the local VFW Post in Roseville. His son, Rudy Pelzman, Jr, currently residing in Sun City Roseville was not only a veteran of the Vietnam Era serving in Korea but later served the federal government as an investigator serving primarily the Roseville area. Many other members of the Pelzman family are laid to rest in the Roseville Cemetery.

Rudy Pelzman, Jr's son, Chris Pelzman's love of sports and public service led him to work for the City of Roseville Parks, Recreation, and Libraries Department in 1997, the same year in which he moved to the city. He began his career as a Recreation Coordinator working primarily with teen programming impacting thousands of teens within the community. He created an event, TRL (Teens Roseville Live), which ran for about 15 years. Offering teens a safe, positive place to hang out on a Friday night. He coordinated youth basketball and volleyball leagues as well as teen trips and community classes. Another large event Chris coordinated was the Hot Summer Nights Hoopla, a basketball tournament attracting teams from all over the western United States. Teams from Alaska to Arizona came to Roseville to participate in this high school tournament which generated over a half million dollars in sports tourism revenue in Roseville annually. Chris also supervised a Teen Advisory Board giving teenagers the opportunity to lead and guide their experiences within the city. And the Student Union program hosted at Eich, Cooley, and Buljan middle schools as well as the Job Experience Training program for teens.

Chris was given the opportunity to coordinate and supervise many other areas within Parks and Recreation. When the Maidu Sports Courts opened he coordinated the first ever inline hockey program as well as the batting cages and concessions.

Currently, Chris coordinates Adult Sports programming, which includes basketball, volleyball, flag football, soccer, and softball leagues. The softball program is the largest program in the Sacramento area. The adult sport leagues help to provide recreational opportunities and impact the lives of thousands of adults in the community. Chris also impacts thousands of adults through special community events. The summer concert series at the Vernon Street Town Square and Comedy Nights helps to create a sense of community, provide joy in the lives of those attending, and provides positive entertainment within the community.

Chris Pelzman's wife, Kristine, also began serving the Roseville community in 1995 while employed with the City of Roseville Parks, Recreation, and Library Department. She began working in Adult Sports then the Student Union program serving hundreds of youth in the community helping to provide them with a safe, positive environment. She currently works for the Roseville City School District serving students and their families with their educational needs.

The youngest generation of the Pelzman Family also has the gift of serving and impacting youth in the community. Lizzie Pelzman, Chris and Kristine's oldest daughter, currently works for the City of Roseville Parks, Recreation, and Libraries. She has been involved with various youth summer camps and special events for the past five years. Chris and

Kristine's youngest daughters, Annie and Sophie, have volunteered with the City of Roseville assisting families to get essential swimming gear at Operation Swim. Also serving youth by volunteering at other local youth sports camps within the community.

The Pelzman Family not only has several generations in Roseville but also has generations impacting the community in a positive direction. I hope you will consider the application to name a public park in honor of the Pelzman Family.
