HQS unit inspections have resumed!

Under federal regulations, all housing units occupied by families receiving assistance must be inspected at least once every two years.

Common items that cause an inspection to fail are:

- Smoke detector(s) and carbon monoxide detectors not working, missing and/or removed
- Broken locks on doors and/or windows
- Inadequate A/C and/or heating
- Major plumbing leak
- No hot or cold water

HQS Unit Inspection notifications will be sent by mail. If your unit has any issues that may not pass inspection, please contact your landlord or property manager immediately to get them corrected before the inspection.

For any questions regarding your unit inspection, please contact your housing technician.

Affordable Connectivity Program: Are you getting your \$30/month internet discount?

The Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) is a U.S. government program that helps many low income households pay for broadband service and internet connected devices.

You are likely eligible if your household's income is below 200% of the Federal Poverty Line, or if you or someone

you live with currently receives a government benefit like SNAP, Medicaid, SSI, WIC, Pell Grant, or Free and Reduced-Price Lunch.

Check to see if your household is eligible and apply online at affordableconnectivity.gov.

Reporting a change in income and/or family composition

As a reminder, it is the responsibility of the head of household to report changes in income or assets and changes in the family composition. All family composition and income changes must be reported within 15 days and **MUST BE IN WRITING**.
