Dear City Council,

I was able to attend the city council meeting through the presentation on the syringe exchange program ordinance. I appreciate what you're doing to be proactive to keep this out of our city. I am concerned about the wording of the ordinance that allows only syringe exchange programs approved by CDPH. We can see that we cannot trust statewide entities and need more local control. I was not able hear the resolution by the board on this matter, but I would change it to more stringent wording: "allow only syringe exchange programs *mandated* by CDPH *and approved by Placer County Department of Health.*" I think the original wording could be used the wrong way by future city council members, citizens, and exchange programs.

In addition, I would mandate distribution zones to be further away from parks, libraries, schools, etc. and make it even more difficult for a program to operate, without expressly forbidding it.

Thanks again for not condoning these horrible programs. Stand up to these ridiculous laws!! They make no sense and are literally ruining California.
