Re: Proposed Ordinance Revising Roseville Municipal Code Chapter 9.1, Massage Services

To Whom It May Concern:

We are reaching out to notify you of an important proposed change to Chapter 9.10 of the Roseville Municipal Code, titled, "Massage Services." As you may be aware, Chapter 9.10 of the Municipal Code regulates massage business activity within the City of Roseville's jurisdictional boundaries. This includes regulations regarding massage business permitting, massage business operations, and education and training requirements for massage professionals.

Please be aware that City Staff intends to present an ordinance to the City Council that would, among other changes, modify the minimum requirements for those who may provide massage services within the City. Specifically, the proposed ordinance establishes that individuals must have an active and valid certificate from the California Massage Therapy Council ("CAMTC") in order to perform massage services, and individuals without CAMTC certification would no longer be able to perform massage services. Importantly, this new requirement would not go into effect until January 1, 2025, allowing massage businesses a "grace period" to come into compliance. There is also a limited exception that will allow massage professionals already practicing within the City to be exempt from this new requirement if they have been practicing massage within the City for an established period of time, are in good standing with the City, and meet certain educational and training requirements.
