RECOMMENDATION TO COUNCIL

- A. Confirm and appoint the seven primary and alternate members (where applicable) to the Community Priorities Advisory Committee selected by the Planning, Parks & Recreation, and Transportation Commissions, Chamber of Commerce, Northstate Building Industry Association, Roseville Joint Union High School District, and Roseville City School District;
- B. Reach consensus on the number of desired at-large applicants to appoint to the Committee (between 8 and 13); and,
- C. Appoint up to 13 members (or other maximum determined by the Council) to the Community Priorities Advisory Committee for the at-large positions from the 46 individuals who submitted applications for consideration.

BACKGROUND

On April 19, 2017, the City Council directed staff to proceed with formation of the Community Priorities Advisory Committee (CPAC) as one of several comprehensive activities to ensure direct and meaningful community participation in reviewing levels of City-provided services. The committee process is intended to bring together Roseville residents and businesses to assess specific general fund City services and programs, and provide policy level recommendations to prioritize what we value as a community. Ultimately, the Committee's work will help inform decisions the City Council and community will make about the programs and levels of service the City should provide and how to fund it, to maintain fiscal stability and ensure the highest quality of life that the City can afford for its residents and businesses.

<u>Membership</u>

Per Council action on April 19th, the Committee's composition is as follows:

- Planning Commission representative (1)
- Parks & Recreation Commission representative (1)
- Transportation Commission representative (1)

- Roseville Chamber of Commerce Board President, CEO, or designee (1)
- Northstate Building Industry Association President/CEO or designee (1)
- Roseville Joint Union High School district Superintendent or designee (1)
- Roseville City School District Superintendent or designee (1)
- At-large community members (8-13) at Council discretion, to seek a diverse range of geographic/neighborhood, generational, and demographic representation on the Committee)
